Following the resignation of Rev. Mike Jones as SCFWB Executive Secretary, the State Executive Committee selected Rev. Todd Smith as the New Executive Secretary at their regular meeting on Thursday, January 4, 2007. Brother Todd will work with Brother Mike during February and then assume the duties of Executive Secretary on March 1, 2007.

Rev. Mike Jones cited fatigue and health issues as well as the leadership of the Lord as his reasons for leaving the State Office. He and Princess Paula are extremely thankful for the great honor that South Carolina Free Will Baptists have bestowed upon them by allowing them to serve during this past 7 1/2 years. It is with great sorrow that they leave office but it is with great JOY that they look forward to God's blessings upon the ministry of this great denomination under the leadership of Brother Todd.

During Brother Mike's tenure as Executive Secretary giving through the State Office has increased nearly a half million dollars a year, a state web site has been established, and increased emphasis has been placed on the Pastoral Care ministry of the State Office.

Interview with Todd Smith

Can you tell me a little bit about your childhood background? I grew up in Dover, NC, and was a member of Tabernacle Free Will Baptist Church, Kinston, NC. My parents and two of my sisters' families continue to faithfully serve there. My third sister is a Free Will Baptist pastor's wife in Townsend, Delaware. We all attended Mt. Calvary Christian Academy, Hookerton, NC, which was a part of Mt. Calvary Free Will Baptist Church.

What about your salvation experience and call to full time Christian ministry? I was saved and baptized at my home church in October 1976 at the age of six. My Sunday school teacher led me to Christ. Free Will Baptist churches in North Carolina utilized the Wilds Christian Camp in Rosman, NC, for many years. It was at the Wilds that I surrendered my life to full time Christian ministry.

Can you give me a brief summary of your preparation for the ministry? I attended Bob Jones University in Greenville, SC, where I received my B.A. in Bible and my M.A. in Pastoral Theology. While attending college at BJU, I began my ministry amongst Free Will Baptist in SC.

In what aspects have you served amongst Free Will Baptist in South Carolina? While in undergrad, I served under the ministry of Rev. Earl Hendrix at First Free Will Baptist Church, Inman, SC. I participated in their Bus Ministry and in the Jr. Church Ministry. In graduate school, I served at Whitney Free Will Baptist Church, Spartanburg, SC, under the ministry of Rev. James Childers and Dr. Bruce Barnes. Later, I also served for a short while as Whitney's interim pastor. While serving in these capacities, I was ordained into the Beaver Creek Association. After graduation, I took my first full time pastorate at Hillside Free Will Baptist Church, Florence, SC where I served for almost 6 years. While in Florence, I was served in the Eastern Conference as Assistant Clerk. In July 1999, God opened the doors for my family to serve as Home Missionaries in Aiken, SC. For the past 10 years, I have served as the South Carolina Free Will Baptist State Association Clerk. Also, for the past few years I have served on the Beaver Creek Association Ordaining Council.

It has been an honor serving amongst Free Will Baptist in South Carolina. In a way, I feel like Free Will Baptist in South Carolina have taken me under their wings and allowed God to grow me on this journey of life. Some of my dearest friends and mentors are in South Carolina.

Can you tell me some things about your immediate family? It was while at Bob Jones University that I met my wife Teresa Smith. Teresa earned her B.A. in English from BJU. She is the daughter of Joe Wallis, a Free Will Baptist minister now serving in NC. Our wedding was held at South Avenue Free Will Baptist Church (now Canaan FWB), in Lancaster, SC, where my father in law was pastoring. My wife served for many years as the South Carolina Women Active for Christ State Secretary. God has blessed us with three wonderful children, Victoria, soon to be 13, Cameron, age 11, and Hunter, age 9.

What vision do you have for Free Will Baptist in South Carolina? Having been a part of the ministry of this state for the past 18 years, I have watched God do some wonderful and marvelous works amongst Free Will Baptist in South Carolina. I have a tremendous vision for what God has yet to accomplish in and through our state. Ever since its conception, our state office has grown into many facets. It is my goal to continue the growth of the ministry of the state office and to meet the many challenges which lay ahead. I have a vision for our state to continue to grow and expand beyond the boundaries of the ever growing needs before us. Every church member, lay leader, minister, missionary, conference, and state leader plays a vital role in the growth of the kingdom of God amongst Free Will Baptist in South Carolina. Without Christ, we can do nothing, but together, we can accomplish great things through Christ, who has called us to be "stewards" in His great work!

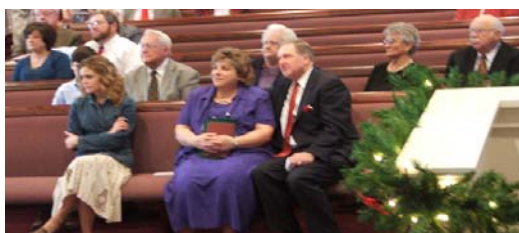

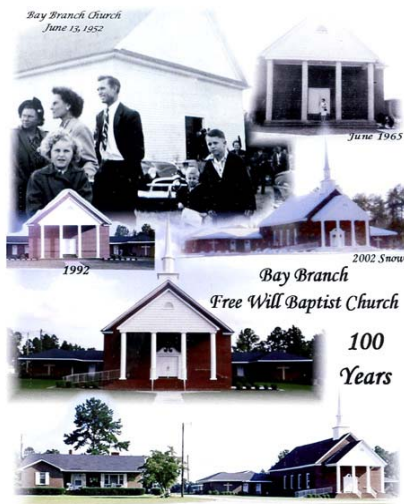

(Submitted by Mrs. Genevieve Waddell) Bay Branch FWB Church in Timmonsville, SC, celebrated its 100th anniversary on Homecoming Day, October 8th, 2006. According to Pastor James Earl Raper, more than 200 members, friends, and five of the 30 former pastors attended, while another four sent greetings, including Dr. Wendell Babcock of Grand Rapids, MI, the church's first full-time pastor.

Those who came for the Old Fashioned Homecoming Day noticed the intertwining of the past, present, and future in the ladies' bonnets, the men's overalls, and the current clothing styles. They also listened to testimonies of longtime members, who thanked the Lord for using Bay Branch throughout these years; they heard the young people in the youth choir sing the praises of the Lord; and they recognized the spirit of a church which is going into the next century with spiritual enthusiasm and plans for service.

In the morning service, people gave testimonies, and the Singletary Family, the youth choir, and other musicians participated, including Pastor James Earl Raper and former Pastor Eugene Waddell (1954-1956), two members of the Gospeliers Quartet, who sang a duet.

One highlight of the celebration was the display of over 400 very old black and white photos and very new colored pictures of Bay Branch's "life," including ones of people of all ages preparing for the celebration.

On the way to dinner, people talked about the historical photographs in the hallways. As they entered the Fellowship Hall, they were surprised, and some wept, when they saw the replica of Bay Branch Church. Mrs. Edith Welch had baked a cake in the shape of the church, and decorated it with the colors of the church, including sides made of red-brick icing and black, edible shingles. The cake was larger than a card table.

After dinner, Sheila Singletary directed music and provided a video presentation of the history and current activities of the church. Afterwards, the church gave plaques to three special women whose lives have been a part of Bay Branch: Mrs. Louise Saverance for 67 years of dedicated service and faithfulness; Mrs. Jewel Lloyd, the oldest member of Bay Branch at 96; and Mrs. Willie Mae Lee, age 89, who was first "carried" to the church at the age of three weeks



All of the activities of the day helped the old and young to appreciate the history of a church whose first service was held in Sam Morrell's home in 1905, later moving to his tobacco barn shelter. Bro. J. B. Oliver, who led the small group to organize into a church, became the first pastor in 1906, a century ago. His two daughters and son from Florence, SC and Florida, came to the Homecoming because they "wanted to represent the Oliver family and to celebrate with the Bay Branch people."

The Oliver children also have special ties to Bay Branch because their maternal grandmother, Mrs. Sam (Ellen) Morrell, donated the land for the building of the first church on the present-day property in 1907.

Since then, various building, renovation and remodeling projects have taken place at Bay Branch. The church continues to add needed facilities, including a playground for children, basketball courts for young people, and shelters for such fellowship and outreach projects as Bay Branch's annual barbecue.

Gloria McKay, the Chair Person of the Homecoming Committee, and a part of the church for 30 years, gathered the history of the church. "I loved meeting the children of the ones who helped get the church started." Perhaps one of the greatest blessings of the day was hearing and seeing the descendants of those who founded the church taking part in the centennial celebration.

Everyone shared their joy at learning about the church's past, what the Lord is doing there now, and plans for its future ministries. Most of all, knowing that a church has been faithful in serving the Lord for one hundred years is a cause for great rejoicing and Bay Branch FWB Church did just that in celebrating its 100th birthday with all the trimmings on its Old-fashioned Homecoming Day.
