## *Hillside Celebrates 40th Anniversary*

Hillside Free Will Baptist Church, located on Purvis Drive, Florence, South Carolina, celebrated its fortieth anniversary on July 14, 1996. Special plaques were presented to three of the original charter members: Julia Dubose (left), Ben Stone (right), and Gertrude Cribb (not pictured). A second plaque was presented to the church by Pastor Todd Smith (center) honoring all nine charter members, including six who are deceased.



Hillside was organized on July 15, 1956 in a rented house. The congregation laid the foundation for the first sanctuary on Thanksgiving day in 1956 on a lot donated by Mr. Charlie Purvis. They held the first service in the new sanctuary in January 1957.

In 1962 they built Sunday School rooms; in 1966, a small fellowship hall; in 1980, a parsonage; and, in 1984, a larger fellowship hall. After several renovation projects from 1990 to 1995, the church has a completely new look.

The Lord has blessed the church with several fine pastors during these forty years. They are: Leland Powell, Lloyd Gore, Paul Clayton, Melvin Adams, Gene Ramsey, Frank Young, Van Powell, Don Tyndall, Jimmy Miller, Buddy Seay and Todd Smith, the current pastor.

We rejoice with this fine congregation in all that God has done for them.

## *Black River Sends 864 Bibles to Mexico*

Many members of Black River Church, Sunday School and VBS contributed to the project. The Olive Branch Book Store, Georgetown (owed by Marshall and Jennifer Beasley, members of Black River), donated 250 Bibles and paid for all shipping expenses.

## *Two SC Students Graduate from FWBCC*

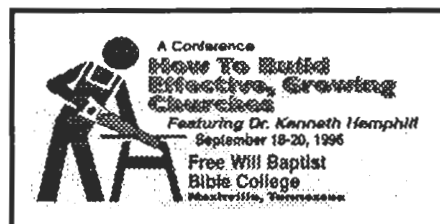
Free Will Baptist Bible College graduated 45 students from 12 states in commencement exercises held on the Nashville campus Thursday, May 16.

## ***Rev. David Anders New Pastor at Pine Grove***

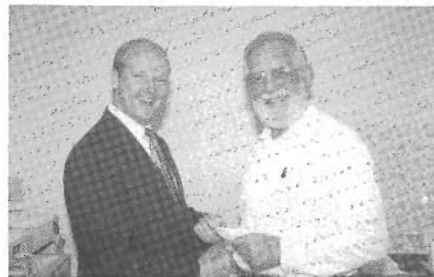

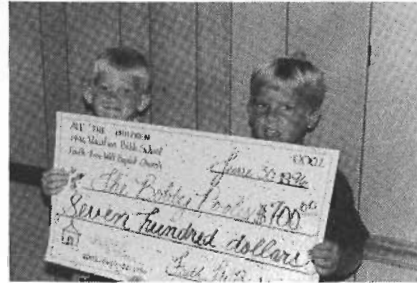
